

EXECUTIVE NOTE TO
THE MOBILITY AND ACCESS COMMITTEE FOR SCOTLAND REVOCATION
REGULATIONS 2008
REVOCATION REGULATIONS 2008
S.S.I. 2008/247

1. The above instrument will be made in exercise of the powers conferred on the Scottish Ministers by section 72 and 81 (2) of the Transport (Scotland) Act 2001. This instrument is subject to the negative resolution procedure.

Policy Objectives

2. The Mobility and Access Committee for Scotland Revocation Regulations 2008 (SSI 2008/187) were made on 14 May and laid in Parliament on 15 May and were due to come into force on 01 July 2008. The policy intention for that instrument was to revoke the Mobility and Access Committee for Scotland Regulations 2002 and a separate instrument would allow an enlarged Public Transport Users' Committee for Scotland to carry out the functions of the Mobility and Access Committee for Scotland.

3. The Transport, Infrastructure, and Climate Change Committee when it met on 10 June 2008 recommended that nothing further should be done under the Mobility and Access Committee for Scotland Revocation Regulations 2008. In the light of that recommendation Ministers have decided that the instrument should be revoked prior to it coming into force and also, at the earliest opportunity to ensure members of Parliament are fully informed of this decision.

4. This revocation means that the Mobility and Access Committee for Scotland will continue to exist as a separate advisory NDPB.

5. This Order will come into effect on 14 June 2008.

Consultation

6. In the circumstances no consultation has been carried out given the immediate requirement for these regulations to be laid.

Financial Effects

7. As the PTUC and MACS share the same secretariat, the instrument has no financial effects on Scottish Government, local government or on business.
